Discussing your property with an appraiser, If you are unable to resolve your concerns with the appraiser, you may file a formal protest, if not already filed. You will then be scheduled for a hearing before the the Appraisal Review Board.

A protest must at least identify the protesting property owner or agent, the property being protested and the reason for protest.

ARB Hearing

The Appraisal Review Board is an independent, impartial group of citizens authorized to resolve disputes between taxpayers and an appraisal district in a formal hearing. The ARB are not employees of the appraisal district.

Each protest submitted will be scheduled for an ARB Hearing. You may discuss your protest informally with an appraiser any time before your hearing. A notice of hearing will be sent 15 days prior to your scheduled hearing. If you file a protest on-line, your hearing date & time also displays in the Online Protest Portal. You may contact us at any time to confirm receipt of your protest and to inquire as to the date & time scheduled for the hearing.

The Wilson County Appraisal District is not a taxing unit or part of the taxing unit, Wilson County. The function of the appraisal district is to determine the market value of each property within each taxing unit boundary and administer exemptions. The governing body of each taxing unit approves a budget for the taxing unit and sets a tax rate that is levied on the taxable property within their jurisdiction.

Taxable Value x Adopted Tax Rate = Property Tax

The Wilson County Appraisal District (located behind Taco Bell) and the Wilson County Tax Office (located downtown) are two separate offices. The Tax Office assesses and collects the property taxes.
